 - Email, grocery stores/other stores, Leader (print/online), from kids and friends, google/Facebook, key "go to" people, community groups talking to one another

Volunteerism-

- Retirees
- Disconnect between volunteer resources and those in need/those who would benefit
- Map of the Community-how are organizations/people connected to one another?
- We are an involved, caring community already

- Serve one another in various capacities
- There is a LOT of need

Coordinate resources for adult-supervised activities across various age groups

- Specific activities, themed, wide variety
- o Accessible (e.g. financial, transportation)

• Structured screening process for youth when issues start:

Formal and/or informal

Mentorship/Apprenticeship opportunities

- Long-term goal
- Formed over a common interest
- Networking

• Creating multigenerational connections (e.g. "tribe" concept in school)

- ALL participate, not optional
- Same teacher throughout

Holistic approaches

- Bridge gaps in community and societal groups-universal
- School/Community garden programs (grow, tend, eat—health emphasis)
- Martina's class meals
- o Family meals
- Coordinated efforts

Are basic human needs being met? (food, clothing, shelter)
